## 4-H GENERAL RULES

# ENTRIES MUST BE COMPLETED BY EXHIBITORS. NO EXCEPTIONS!

- 1. Entries in 4-H Classes must have been in conjunction with an approved project.
- 2. Entries will be accepted **Monday**, **June 16**, **2025**, **from 9 AM until noon**. No exhibits will be accepted at any other time. Entries will be accepted at the 4-H Ag Building at the Trimble County Park.
- 3. Members may enter only one exhibit in any one class. All items must have been made since the last County Fair.
- 4. Age eligibility: To enter exhibits in the 4-H division a member must have reached their 9<sup>th</sup> birthday by January 1, 2025, but not have reached their 19<sup>th</sup> birthday by January 1, 2025.
- 5. All items to be picked up at the exhibit hall between 8:00 p.m. 9:00 p.m. Thursday, June 19, 2025, or Friday, June 20, 2025, at the Trimble County Cooperative Extension Office after 1:00 p.m. Claim check must be presented.
- 6. The Trimble County 4-H Council, Inc., will not be responsible or liable for personal injury, loss, or damages.
- 7. Decisions of the judges are final.
- 8. Premiums: Class Champions-\$1; Blue-\$4; Red-\$3; White-\$2.
- 9. All 4-H exhibits are judged on the Danish system. FFA and Open class exhibits are judged using the American judging system.

# OPEN CLASS EXHIBITS GENERAL RULES

## ENTRIES MUST BE COMPLETED BY EXHIBITORS. NO EXCEPTIONS!

- 1. Open Class exhibits are open to all exhibitors unless otherwise specified.
- 2. An exhibitor is allowed to enter only one (1) entry per class.
- 3. No article having previously won a blue ribbon may be shown.
- 4. All exhibits must be entered *Monday, June 16, 2025, from 9:00 a.m. till 12 noon.* Entries will be accepted at the 4-H Ag Building at the Trimble County Park.
- 5. All exhibits must be picked up at the exhibit hall between 8:00 p.m. 9:00 p.m. Thursday, June 19, 2025, or after 1:00 p.m. on Friday, June 20, at the Trimble County Cooperative Extension Office, by claim check.
- 6. Premiums: Champion-\$1; Blue-\$4; Red-\$3; White-\$2. The American judging system will be used when judging the open class exhibits.

- Yellow-ear, from the current year's crop, 8 ears shucked, and labeled with variety and yield.
- Yellow-shelled, from the previous year's crop, 0.5 gallon in a container, and labeled to show variety and yield.

#### White CORN

- White-ear, from the previous year's crop, 8 ears shucked, and labeled with variety and yield.
- White-ear, from the current year's crop, 8 ears shucked and labeled with variety and yield.
- White-shelled, from the previous year's crop, 0.5 gallon in a container, and labeled to show variety and yield.

### FIELD SOYBEANS

- Soybean plants best group of three plants that have reached bloom or pod stage, displayed as a hanging bunch with soil free roots attached labeled to show variety
- Soybeans, any variety from the previous year crop, 1 gallon zip lock bag labeled to show variety and yield.

## **GRAIN SORGHUM**

- Grain Sorghum from the current year's crop, three stalks tied together below leaves, with roots in tact, but free of soil and labeled to show variety.
- Grain Sorghum from the previous year's crop, 1 gallon zip lock bag, and labeled to show variety and yield

#### **SWEET SORGHUM**

Sweet sorghum from the current year's crop, three stalks tied together below leaves, with roots intact but free of soil, and labeled to show variety

## WHEAT (Soft, Red, Winter)

- Wheat from the current year's crop, ½ gallon in a container, and labeled to show variety and yield.
- Barley from the current year's crop, ½ gallon in a container, and labeled to show variety and yield.
