

College of Agriculture -H Youth Development ASSUMPTION of RISK and RELEASE

The Kentucky 4-H <u>High Adventure</u> Program is a high adventure program for youth 13 years of age and older and adults and is coordinated by the Department of 4-H Youth Development, University of Kentucky Cooperative Extension Service.

In consideration of being allowed to participate in the Kentucky 4-H <u>High Adventure</u> Program in 2022, I hereby release the Board of Trustees of the University of Kentucky, University of Kentucky Cooperative Extension Service, the State of Kentucky, and their agents, officers, employees, and registered volunteers from all claims, demands, and causes of action of any kind including claims for negligence, which may arise from my participation in the aforementioned program.

Kentucky 4-H <u>High Adventure</u> Programs often occur in wild and remote settings. It is important that participants and parents understand the risks associated with these educational adventure activities. Some, but not all, of the activities include:

Travel and living in remote wilderness settings Chores: cooking, cleaning, hanging bear bags Use of liquid fuel (white gas or propane) stoves Wilderness first aid and rescue, real and simulated Backpacking, camping, canoeing, rafting, rock climbing Transportation in 15 passenger vans

Some, but not all of the inherent or other risks that the participant may or will be exposed to include, but are not limited to:

Misjudgments by self, others or staff Unpredictable weather

problems

Extreme cold & heat, sun, lightning, rain and snow

maintenance

Unmarked or obscured hazards
Moving water in creeks, rivers, whitewater
Sustained hiking, lifting, or carrying heavy packs
Steep slopes, difficult terrain, downed trees
Animal hazards: stings, bites, poisoning

Improper hygiene or water purification techniques Dangerous road conditions and transportation

Failure of equipment, despite reasonable

Falling down or slipping Falling rocks, ice, snow and trees

High altitudes

Encounters with wild animals and wildlife
Other risks associated with adventure activities

These and other activities, risks, hazards and dangers can result in, but not limited to:

Mental or physical bodily injury, illness or trauma, death or property damage or loss.
